

Monkeying Around Progress Chart Instructions

1. Print and cut out all the leaves, vines, flowers, bananas, mud puddles, and monkeys. (Print as many vines as you will need to span the space you are filling.) Then attach the vines to your classroom wall in a line using tape, sticky tack, etc. On top of the vines, add leaves, flowers, bananas, and mud puddles in whatever order you'd like.
2. Write each student's name on a monkey.
3. Create a list of ways a student's monkey can make progress. (See sample list below.) Each time a student earns credit, move their rocket forward to the next leaf, flower, banana, etc.
4. Reward students once they reach a certain point (i.e. every time they land on a flower, etc.)

Here are some options:

- Landing on or passing a flower is worth a small prize.
- Landing directly on a banana is worth a larger prize.
- Landing directly on a mud puddle means moving back to the previous mud puddle. (Note: You can even give students an option to avoid moving back by being able to say their memory verse.)
