Sacrifices Visuals Instructions

- 1. Print out all three pages. Consider printing on card stock or laminating for longer use.
- 2. Page 2 can be used on its own as a reference.
- 3. Cut out the shapes on page 4. As you talk about each sacrifice, attach the square to a blank on page 3 with sticky tack, glue dots, or double-sided tape.
- 4. To change it up, put the squares in a basket. Let each student choose a square. Talk about whatever sacrifice or teaching point is on the square.



Sacrifices |





a bull, bird, or ram totally burnt to show devotion or commitment to God or to atone for accidental sin



required sacrifice with specific rules offered to atone for sin and cleanse from uncleanness



also called meat or meal; cake or baked bread made of grain, fine flour, and oil and salt; offered in thanks to God for providing



required sacrifice of a ram, offered to atone for sin and cleanse from uncleanness and illness



spotless animal, bread, or grains offered in thanksgiving and fellowship with a shared meal

Sacrifices were:

- offered over and over.
- a temporary way to atone for sin.
- a picture of the Lord Jesus Christ, Who would be the perfect, final sacrifice for sin.
